

CONDITIONS of ENTRY

1. Entry forms and all required fees to be submitted by 9.00 pm on **Thursday 20th August** at the latest (see entry form for details) to Andrew and Marian Green at 50 Mile St, with the exception of entries for Classes 104 & 105 which must be received by 9pm on Friday 14th August. Entries without fees can be submitted by email to bozg50@gmail.com.

NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED

2. **Fees:** Young People's Section and Conservation Section - **FREE**.
Adults (over 16 years) **50p** per entry.
3. Entries accepted & judged as either **Named Individuals, Family Group [max 5] or Group/Organisation**.
4. Entry cards to be displayed with exhibit, will be issued on receipt of entry forms and may be collected on the door when staging exhibits.
5. Variety or cultivar should be stated, where applicable, with the exhibit.
6. Exhibits to be staged between 9.30 and 11.30 am on the day of the show. Members of the public must then retire from the room until 2.00 pm.
7. Award of prizes will be at the sole discretion of the Judges, who may withhold any prize (including first prize) for want of competition or insufficient merit, and their decision will be final.
8. The Committee requests that all exhibits must be the work of the named exhibitor.
9. No exhibit to have been previously entered in the Bozeat Show.
10. Exhibits not for sale, to be removed between 3.45 & 4.00 pm. Entries remaining will be sold at the auction. Prize money not collected by 4.00 pm will be donated to Bozeat Show funds.
11. All entries shown at exhibitor's own risk.
12. Viewing will be between 2.00 pm and 3.45 pm.
13. The proceeds are to be divided between various projects and charities.
14. If conditions mean that the Show cannot go ahead as planned, the Committee reserves the right to exhibit a subset of classes through other channels.

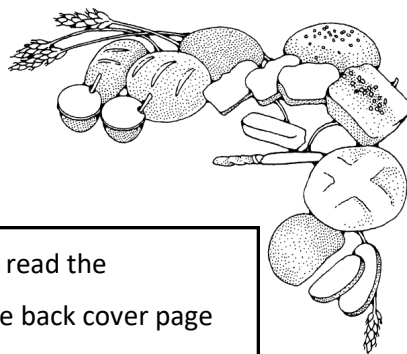

SECTION 8 - Conservation

This is a completely new Section for 2020. It is zero waste, no single use material, 100% compostable! Ideally everything exhibited will have originated within Bozeat, or your local parish boundary.

There will be a separate award for the exhibitor with the most points in this Section. It is sponsored by the Churchyard Conservation team, who will provide a wildlife gardening book as a prize

In line with the theme of the Section we will not be charging any entry fees for these classes, and there will not be any cash prizes. As a result entries for these classes can be received electronically. First Prize winners for each section will receive a certificate, either electronically or printed on 100% recycled paper/card. However 1st/2nd/3rd places will count towards overall awards.

*Judging of the first two classes will take place by visiting your garden/plot in the week before the show. As a result **entries for these classes must be submitted by 9pm on Friday 14th August 2020.** To minimise carbon emissions (or the judge's cycling legs), we will only accept entries within a radius of 4 miles from St Marys Church Bozeat.*

Photos will be displayed digitally on the day. In the event that the Show is not able to go ahead as a public event on 22nd August, pictures and/or short videos of all entries (taken by the judge or steward) will be made available electronically through appropriate channels.



- 104 Wildlife-friendly garden or area of a garden. *Guidance for judging: should include any/all of compost heap/leaf/log/stone pile, nesting/hibernation sites for birds/insects/other wildlife, perennial herbaceous plants/shrubs trees for nectar/pollen/berries etc, wildlife pond or other feature(s) to attract wildlife; judging will not be based on overall size but by variety and wildlife potential of features.*
- 105 Mini-meadow (minimum size 1m by 1m). *Guidance for judging: native wildflowers present and allowed to flower and set seed; judging will not be based on overall size but by variety and quality of grasses, flowers etc.*
- 106 Wonderful weeds posy. Tied with jute twine and displayed in a small glass jar or other recycled container
- 107 A piece of art/design/collage featuring local native wildflowers, grasses, seed heads, leaves twigs etc. The whole item should be 100% compostable.
- 108 A craft item made entirely from materials sourced within your local parish – new or recycled.
- 109 A photograph of wildlife in your garden. To be submitted electronically (will be judged and displayed digitally on the day).



SECTION 6 - Cookery, Preserves and Eggs

TIPS: All preserves should be presented in clean jars sealed with wax discs and cellophane. Use a plain white label to record contents and date. Cakes should be evenly baked with straight sides and lining papers removed and they should be free from any cooling tray marks. Eggs should be presented clean.

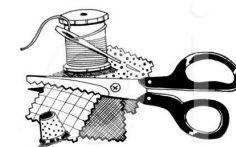

SECTION 5 - Vegetables

TIPS: Present clean, unblemished produce of a uniform shape, colour and size. Carrots, beetroot & parsnips must be bunched, with the leaves left intact. The tops of onions should be trimmed and tied down to leave two inches of neck. Roots should be trimmed to the root base and excess soil removed. Stalks on beans should be left intact.
